## FROM THE RABBI

Recently the president of our congregation, Dr. Nate Ginsberg and I, attended the biennial of the union for Reform Judaism, the every two-year conference of the largest movement of Judaism in North America – Reform Judaism. More than 5000 people were in attendance. The conference, held in Washington DC, featured such illustrious speakers as President Barack Obama, Congressman Eric Cantor, and defense minister Ehud Barak from Israel.

Many bemoan the future of denominational religion. Clearly there has been a weakening in almost all mainline American denominations, and certainly to a much larger extent a turning away from religion in Europe. There was no sense however, of religion's slipping in the minds of Americans at this recent conference. The theme for the future was youth engagement. The Union for Reform Judaism will be working on multiple formats in ways to revitalize Reform Judaism among our young people.

I am becoming ever more convinced of the deep religious yearnings among both the young and old, and among the non-affiliated and the unchurched. There is an untapped religious yearning among tens of millions of Americans – we have at times however failed to address the real human needs.

These are the needs: to find meaning, purpose, understanding of our place in the world and our place

in days to come. The world does not need simplistic, dumbed down, mindless religious submission, but rather thoughtful, intellectual, inspiring, and real answers to the great questions of life. As mainline religious denominations have faltered, fundamentalist nondenominational groups have risen to fill in the gaps. However, the intellectual spiritual seekers have often simply turned away from religion altogether. This is the biggest religious void America today. To the religious denominations able to tap into this group there is a great future. We live in a post-modern, post-ethnic, universal world. No matter what nationality, ethnicity, or race, the human needs remain the same. To the religious denominations that can address these true human needs with clarity there is no need to fear the future. However to the religious denominations steeped in ethnocentricity, committed to preserving themselves at all costs, and refusing to transform themselves, I see only a slow weakening and dissolution.

Ours is a time like never before that particularly calls for creativity and reinvention. Just as our economy has faltered so has religious life in America. This falling cycle might be preparing us, with the proper thought and organization, to a religious revival in our postmodern world.

### **FROM OUR ARCHIVES**

Of the Temple's twenty five rabbis, Maurice Fluegel, who served for less than a year beginning in either 1867 or 1868, is probably the most elusive. Very little is known about his tenure with Sha'arai Shomayim. He served as rabbi after Leopold Wintner, who left Mobile in 1867, and before Abraham Laser, who became rabbi in 1869. During that period Fluegel was not listed in the City Directory or in the federal census.

Information is available about Fluegel from The Jewish Museum of Maryland, which holds a rather extensive collection of his publications. From the Museum's records we learn that Fluegel was born in Germany in 1832, was educated in Germany and Paris, and earned degrees in economics, history, languages and theology. He was married to Hannah Levald, originally from Copenhagen, and they had four children. A biography from the Museum states Fluegel served as a rabbi in Mobile from 1867-1869. He also served in congregations in Quincy, Illinois; Pine Bluff, Arkansas; Erie Pennsylvania; Kalamazoo, Michigan; and in

his last post in Baltimore. He died in Baltimore in 1911.

Fluegel was apparently very scholarly and wrote extensively on a large range of subjects. The Maryland collection contains over 300 articles, essays, speeches, or manuscripts penned by Fluegel, who wrote fluently in English, Hebrew, and German. Topics of his writings include philosophy, religion, literary criticism, social issues, education, and ethics.

Why Fluegel's stay in Mobile was short-lived is not known. Perhaps he took the position on an interim basis until a permanent rabbi could be hired. His exclusion from the City Directories of that period may indicate he boarded temporarily with congregants and did not intend to remain in Mobile long-term. According to Robert Zietz, author of the Temple's history *The Gates of Heaven*, Fluegel's service in Mobile was mentioned in Isaac Markens' book, *The Hebrews in America*, as well as in the Maryland museum collection. However, the few surviving documents of the Temple from that period do not reference him. His tenure with the congregation remains a mystery.

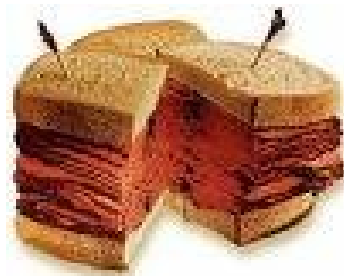
